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### THE GREEN HOUSE

By-law No. 1988-40 - passed March 14, 1988

#### Legal Description

The Green House, 77 Peter Street North, Orillia ON L3V 4Y9

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Orillia, in the County of Simcoe and being composed of Part of Lot 5 on the south side of Neywash Street, as shown on Registered Plan No. 8 for the City of Orillia more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the north-east angle of the said lot;

Thence running southerly along the west limit of Peter Street 102 feet to a point;

Thence running westerly parallel to Neywash Street to the westerly limit of the said Lot 5 to a point;

Thence northerly along the said westerly limit of said lot, 102 feet to the south limit of Neywash Street to a point;

Thence running easterly along the south limit of Neywash Street to the point of commencement.

#### Reasons for Designation

The Green House is recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. This handsome home was built in 1883 by the Rev. Dr. John Gray two years after he resigned from his position as first incumbent of the Orillia Presbyterian Church. The orange/red brick of the exterior is highlighted by the buff coloured brickwork most notably in the quoins, arched lintels and string course, while double brackets showing ornate scroll work cap each exterior corner at the eaves.
