ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Orillia, in the County of Simcoe, and being composed of all of Lot 7 on the south side of Neywash Street and the westerly 45 feet of perpendicular width throughout from front to rear of Lot 8 on the south side of Neywash Street, as shown of Plan registered on the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the County of Simcoe as Plan Number 8.

Reasons for Designation

The St. James Anglican Church Rectory has been recommended for designation for architectural and historic reasons. This dwelling was built in 1874 on land purchased by Rev. Thomas B. Read and Wardens George Holden and George Hunter from the parcel set aside for use of the Indians. The incumbent rector from 1888 until 1911 was Canon Richard Greene, immortalized as "Dean Drone" in Stephen Leacock's "Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town."
