Legal Description

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Orillia in the County of Simcoe and being composed of Part Lots 21 and 22 in Couchiching Park, as shown on a plan registered in the Registry Division for the County of Simcoe as Plan Number 8 and is more particularly shown outlined in red on the attached plan of survey.

Reasons for Designation

The Couchiching Beach Park Bandstand has been recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. It was designed by W.H. Croker and built by W.L. Bennett in 1909, and was the focal point of social and cultural events in Orillia for many years. This ornate octagonal structure in its park setting overlooking Lake Couchiching serves to remind Orillia and its visitors of the City's valuable heritage.
