Legal Description

The Church of The Guardian Angels, 115 West Street North, Orillia, Ontario.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Orillia in the County of Simcoe and being composed of all of Lots 11 and 12 and part of Lot 13 on the west side of West Street and part of Lot 1 on the north side of Penetang Street as shown on a Plan registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the County of Simcoe as Plan No. 137.

Reasons for Designation

The Church of the Guardian Angels has been recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. It was built in 1911, entirely of natural limestone, by Mr. R. Sheeny of Peterborough, under the supervision of Father Trayling. Its tall spire that dominates the skyline of Orillia, and the extravagant use of stained glass and marble, make it an edifice truly worth preservation.
