The Orillia Presbyterian Church, 99 Peter Street North, Orillia, Ontario.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Orillia in the County of Simcoe and being composed of all of Lot 5 and part of Lot 4 on the north side of Neywash Street and part of the south part Lots 3, 4 and 5 on the south side of Tecumseth Street as shown on a Plan registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the County of Simcoe as Plan No. 8.

Reasons for Designation

The Orillia Presbyterian Church has been recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. The building was completed in 1889, under the service of Rev. R.N. Grant. Designed by Architects Gordon and Helliwell of Toronto, the structure with its three towers employs a variety of design features, and compliments the older residential area in which it is located.
