
## Notice of Public Information Centre #2 Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Laclie Street Reconstruction

### The Study

The City of Orillia (City) is conducting a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for the reconstruction of Laclie Street from Neywash Street to Murray Street following the recommendation of the City of Orillia 2019 Multi-Modal Transportation Master Plan (MTMP). The site location and approximate extent of the Study Area are shown on the map.

### The Process

The Study is being planned under Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process (Municipal Engineers Association, October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011, and 2015), which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. A virtual Public Information Centre (PIC#1) was held April 8, 2021, to May 7, 2021, to present possible solutions for roadway widening, including the addition of vehicle travel lanes, bike lanes and modification to bus laybys. After consideration of public, Indigenous and agency comments received during PIC#1, and with consideration of the natural, cultural, technical, and financial environment, a preferred solution has been identified. That preferred solution involves reconstructing Laclie Street to a two-lane standard with bus laybys but without bike lanes between Neywash Street and North Street East and to a two or three lane standard with bike lanes but without bus laybys from North Street East to a point between North Street East and St. Jean Street and to a three-lane standard with bike lanes but without bus laybys between that point and Murray Street. At the conclusion of the Study, the process will be documented in a study report, prepared for public review.



### Comments Invited

A second virtual Public Information Centre (PIC#2) has been arranged to provide a summary of the project, the preferred solutions for roadway widening identified following PIC#1, and the proposed design options being considered to implement the preferred solution, as well as the next steps in the process. The City is inviting comments from the public for consideration in the evaluation of design options and input into the project planning. PIC#2 information materials will be available on the City website at [orillia.ca/lacliestreet](http://orillia.ca/lacliestreet) starting Aug. 25, 2022. Your comments on the project and PIC#2 information materials are encouraged by Sept. 26, 2022. Following PIC#2, and in consideration of comments received, the preferred design option(s) will be identified.

## Calling All Artists: Submit for the City's Largest Public Art Installation!

The Art in Public Places Committee is excited to announce its newest call for artists for the largest installation of public art within the City of Orillia to date.

Artists are invited to submit a proposal to one or more of seven site locations that incorporates the project's theme: CROSSROADS, CONNECTIONS, and INTERSECTIONS. The theme is inspired by the City's strategic location along major highways and waterways, connecting people to Orillia for thousands of years.

Seven locations were selected by the Committee and approved by Orillia Council for the installation of public art. These are strategically located at intersections and entry points to the City, near tourism nodes along the City's active transportation network.

This call for public art is the largest in the City's history. Artists interested in submitting will be asked to participate in a two-stage process for most sites with a proposal deadline of Monday, Sept. 19, 2022, and a conceptual design deadline of Monday, Oct. 31, 2022. # Centennial Drive Reconstruction

## Phase 1 Project Update

The Centennial Drive Reconstruction Project Phase 1 contractor, J.B. Enterprises Ltd., has restarted construction of the sanitary sewage pump station, road reconstruction of approximately 220 m and placement of a sanitary sewer on the Esplanade. Normal working hours are limited to 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

The City of Orillia does everything it can to limit the inconvenience of road improvements and we thank you for your patience and co-operation throughout the duration of the project.

## Phase 2 Project Update

The Centennial Drive Reconstruction Project Phase 2 contractor, Arnott Construction, has begun mobilization of site trailers, equipment and materials. Set up of traffic control signage, infrastructure investigation, as well as removals of existing infrastructure has also begun.

As site setup begins, boat trailer parking will be impacted (the former CPR right-of-way). Both the Centennial Boat Launch Parking Lot and the Port of Orillia Parking Lot will not be affected and will remain open.

As the project progresses, updates will be provided including further information about traffic and parking impacts and alternative options for boat launch users.
