Council adopts Climate Change Action Plan for City of Orillia

During its April 25 meeting, Orillia Council adopted the City's new Climate Change Action Plan in principle. Entitled *Orillia's Climate Future*, this plan will serve as a roadmap for climate action decision making and priority setting in the City of Orillia over the next 30 years.

In addition to adopting the plan in principle, Council approved corporate greenhouse gas emission reduction targets of 50 per cent by 2030 and net zero (100 per cent) by 2040 and endorsed community reduction targets of 33 per cent by 2030 and net zero by 2050.

Municipal Comprehensive Review Process Update

As the City continues its Municipal Comprehensive Review (MCR) process to plan for future growth, at its meeting on April 25, 2022, Council provided direction to update the City's Land Needs Assessment to contemplate higher minimum intensification and designated greenfield density targets for residential development to be considered with boundary expansion recommendations.

In addition to considering a higher intensification strategy, Council also directed staff to establish a set of 'Made in Orillia' planning principles to manage growth from an environmental, cultural, economic and social perspective. This will be completed as part of the Official Plan update, which is anticipated to begin in 2023.

Before any decisions will be made by Council in 2023, further public and stakeholder consultation will take place, including opportunities to provide input and feedback on increased intensification and greenfield density residential development options and the preliminary results of the Technical Land Evaluation.

Reminder to Taxpayers

The second instalment of the 2022 Interim Tax Bill is due and payable **May 15, 2022**. Ratepayers are reminded that penalty is added to all past due instalments or part thereof as follows:

- 1.25 per cent added on the first working day following the due date and
- 1.25 per cent per month thereafter beginning June 1, 2022.

Failure to receive the tax bill does not relieve the property owner from payment of taxes or liability for penalty for late payment.

TAKE NOTICE that the City of Orillia deemed the following application to amend the City's Zoning By-law 2014-44 a "Complete" application under Subsection 34 of the *Planning Act* on the 14th day of April, 2022.

AND TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia will hold an **Electronic** Public Meeting on **June 6, 2022 at 1 p.m.**, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be dealt with, to consider the following Zoning By-law Amendment Application:

The subject property is designated "Living Area - Stable Neighbourhood" in the City's Official Plan and is currently zoned "Institutional One" (I1) under the City's Zoning By-law 2014-44, as amended.

Purpose and Effect:

The purpose and effect of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is to change the zoning on the subject lands from Institutional to Residential and to recognize existing deficiencies related to Lot Area and the Rear Yard Setback, as the intention is to sever the lands into a separate and conveyable residential lot.

Proposal:

It is proposed that a portion of 252 Peter St. N. be re-zoned to Residential One Exception (R1-X).



ANY PERSON OR AGENCY who is of the opinion that holding the hearing as an electronic hearing is likely to cause them significant prejudice may make a submission to the Clerk's Division in writing by delivery to the City drop slot or by email to clerks@orillia.ca on or before noon on June 3, 2022, and if City of Orillia Council is satisfied that holding the hearing as an electronic hearing is likely to cause the party significant prejudice, then the hearing will be rescheduled as an oral hearing. If a person or agency does not make a submission to the Clerk's Division in this manner by noon on June 3, 2022, and the person or agency does not participate in the hearing in accordance with this Notice, then the Public Meeting may proceed without the party's participation and the party will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceeding.
