



Highlights from the Council Chamber

Council Meeting – June 25, 2018

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Monday, June 25, 2018.

The following includes changes or recorded votes to recommendations from the June 18, 2018 Council Committee meeting. The wording below does not represent the exact wording of the motion and is meant as highlights of what was adopted.

- A request to install a 'Children at Play' sign at the intersection of Bay Street and North Street East was received as information. The correspondence from Christopher Blueman will be forwarded to staff in conjunction with Policy 2.6.1.1 - Guidelines and Procedures for Traffic Calming.
- **A recorded vote was requested for the following:**
The City of Orillia Fire Department was authorized to renew the agreement with Dr. Michael Boucher, Boucher Medicine Professional Corporation, to provide medical oversight and training to the Department until July 31, 2021.
Recorded vote: Carried (unanimous)
- The report regarding improvements to road cut practices was received as information. Staff will report to 2019 Budget regarding the cost and logistics of improving road cut practices and implementation of an annual restoration program.
- The report received from Nigel Bellchamber, Amberley Gavel Ltd. regarding the investigation of a complaint with respect to a Council Committee in Closed Session meeting held on February 5, 2018 was received as information.
- Further to the deputation by The Skateparkers regarding a request for the designation of a site and funding support for a skatepark, staff was requested to consider this request as part of the design plan for Foundry Park or other location in the City.

The following are recommendations from Council Committee on June 18, 2018 that were adopted by Council with no changes on June 25, 2018:

- An Orillia Farmers' Market sign will be installed on the concrete wall facing West Street adjacent to the north entrance of Municipal Parking Lot 4, as set out in Schedule "A" of the report. \$2,000 was allocated from Operating Contingency.
- A report from the Parks, Recreation and Culture Department regarding the creation of a pump track at Foundry Park was received as information.

- The design concept set out in Schedule "A" of the Corporate Visual Identity Program report was adopted as the City of Orillia's new corporate visual identity.
- Staff was directed to consider Orchard Point, with the exception of the lands with frontage along Atherley Road (Highway 12), for designation as "Living Area - Stable Neighbourhood" in the City's next Official Plan review and update.
- The Traffic and Parking By-law Number 2007-55 Section 7(c) was amended by inserting the words: "if the vehicle is located within 1.5 metres of the sidewalk and roadway," after the words adjacent roadway, such that the provision reads as follows, "on a driveway, between a sidewalk and the adjacent roadway if the vehicle is located within 1.5 metres of the sidewalk or roadway, or if there is no sidewalk within 1.5 metres of the roadway." The by-law amendment will take effect upon approval of the set fine by the Regional Senior Justice in the Central East Region.
- Council approved a Capital budget for \$300,000 to be funded from Development Charges. Staff was directed to acquire two sidewalk plow machines for use in the 2018/2019 winter control season. The operating budget implications will be referred to the 2019 Budget deliberations.
