



Highlights from the Council Chamber

Council Meeting – May 6, 2019

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Monday, May 6, 2019.

The following includes changes or recorded votes to recommendations from the April 29, 2019 Council Committee meeting. The wording below does not represent the exact wording of the motion and is meant as highlights of what was adopted.

- Report Number 2019-3 of Budget Committee was adopted.
- The report from Information Orillia was received as information. The semi-annual payment instalment of \$7,500 was released to Information Orillia.
- Further to the report dated April 2, 2019 from the Treasury and Development Services and Engineering Departments, and in consideration of the City's previously approved grant of \$390,000 provided to Building Hope, Council authorized a final grant to the Building Hope Project in the amount equal to the City's portion of applicable Development Charges for Phases 1 and 2 only (up to a maximum of \$450,000 (including interest)) calculated at the time of Building Permit issuance. The funding will be released following confirmation that an occupancy permit has been issued. Funding will be appropriated from the Major Capital Facilities Reserve. The grant is conditional on the organization agreeing to maintain the affordability of supportive housing units for a maximum term of 20 years. Building Hope is required to pursue further options related to securities and report back to Council at a Special Meeting to be held on May 27, 2019.
- WHEREAS the Province of Ontario is introducing a new model of health care across the Province, to be called Ontario Health Teams;
AND WHEREAS the health care providers comprising the Couchiching geographic region of the City of Orillia, Chippewas of Rama First Nation, and the Townships of Ramara, Severn, and Oro-Medonte, constituted as the Couchiching Sub Regional Planning Table wish to apply to the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care to be designated as a local Ontario Health Team;
AND WHEREAS the proposed naming of the local Ontario Health Team will occur during the self-assessment process;
AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia strongly supports the health and wellbeing of its citizens as illustrated by the City's annual contributions to the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit and the County of Simcoe Human Services, capital investments in active transportation and recreation, and the 2018 participation in the measurement of citizen health and wellbeing through the Canadian Index of Wellbeing;

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia fully endorses the application to the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care to designate the Couchiching Family Health Team, Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital, the Local Health Integration Network (LHIN) Home and Community Care to begin collaboration and engage other local health care services as a local Ontario Health Team;

AND further, the City of Orillia commits to contribute directly in this effort through continued participation of Councillor Ted Emond as a member of the Couchiching Sub-Regional Planning Team;

AND further, Councillor Emond report periodically to Council on progress of the application and how the City of Orillia can further support the establishment of a local Ontario Health Team.

- **A recorded vote was requested for the following:**

A by-law to confirm an Agreement of Purchase and Sale with Tai Fac Chow for 150 Front Street South, Orillia, and to authorize the sale thereof.

The following City policy was repealed:

- 3.3.1.2. Special Transit Fares – OWLS
- The pilot project for the keeping of laying hens was extended for a further four years, with the same rules and regulations as set out in the previous pilot project. Staff will report back to Council Committee in April 2023 on the outcome of the extended pilot project. Chapter 117 of the City of Orillia Municipal Code - Licensing Appeal Tribunal was amended to reflect the authority for the Tribunal to hear any appeals related to hen coop licensing.
- Policy 1.10.5.1. - Strategic Asset Management was adopted as set out in Schedule "A" of the report.
- The City of Orillia will join the Federation of Canadian Municipalities - Local Governments for Sustainability Partners for Climate Protection Program. The By-law attached as Schedule "A" to the report will be presented to Council to appoint the Mayor and Manager of Environmental Compliance to oversee the implementation of the Partners for Climate Protection Program milestones. Staff was authorized to develop a Climate Change Action Plan, with support from the Partners for Climate Protection Program, and report back to Council.
- The report regarding the findings of the Facility Assessment conducted by the Canadian Conservation Institute on the condition of the Leacock Museum's facilities and collection was received as information. The report will be forwarded to the successful proponent for the Leacock Master Plan update.
- Staff was authorized to submit a bid to the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport to host the 2023 Ontario 55+ Winter Games.
