



Highlights from the Council Chamber

Council Meeting – August 15, 2019

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Thursday, Aug. 15, 2019.

The following includes changes or recorded votes to recommendations from the Aug. 12, 2019 Council Committee meeting. The wording below does not represent the exact wording of the motion and is meant as highlights of what was adopted.

- Further to the request of the Orillia Youth Opportunities Committee, Councillor Jay Fallis was appointed as the Council liaison on the Orillia Sunshine Youth Senate for the remainder of the Council term.
- The installation of solar panels at the Orillia Recreation Centre was referred to the 2020 Budget deliberations.

The following are recommendations from Council Committee on Aug. 12, 2019 that were adopted by Council with no changes on Aug. 15, 2019:

- The report regarding the Municipal Services Management Agreement, Option 1 was adopted as set out in the report. \$10,000 was approved and allocated from Operating Contingency.
- Staff was authorized to notify the Ontario Small Urban Municipality (OSUM) Executive Committee of the City of Orillia's interest to host the 2021 annual conference.
- The approved budget allocation for the Metro Roof Replacement Project was increased from \$600,000 to \$660,000. The additional allotment of \$60,000 will be funded from the Land Acquisition Reserve.
- As recommended in the report regarding temporary on-street parking on University Avenue, Traffic and Parking By-law Number 2007-55 was amended to repeal Section 2(a) of Article 12.
- The Committee of Adjustment was authorized to consider a request for reduction of four parking spaces on the properties known municipally as 64, 66, 68, 70 and 74 Elgin Street.
- Staff was directed to prepare a report with respect to the following:
The options, opportunities and impact of increasing the level of service related to the enforcement of the Property Standards and Clean and Clear By-laws. The report will be presented to Council Committee by September 30, 2019.
