



Highlights from the Council Chamber

Council Meeting – April 23, 2018

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Monday, April 23, 2018. Please note: **The wording below does not represent the exact wording of the motion and is meant as highlights of what was adopted.**

The following are recommendations from Council Committee on April 16, 2018 that were adopted by Council with no changes on April 23, 2018:

- Option 1 was adopted as set out in the confidential Report ED-18-10 from the Economic Development Department regarding the protection of municipal services with respect to 340 Collins Drive. \$9,500 for legal fees and survey work was approved and allocated from the Water and Wastewater Reserve.
- Option 1 was adopted as set out in the confidential Report ED-18-11 from the Economic Development, Facilities and Special Projects and Development Services and Engineering Departments regarding a SMART Cities partnership opportunity. \$5,000 was approved for legal fees and allocated from the Operating Contingency Reserve.
- The Orillia Youth Centre was authorized to pay a single, one-day Refreshment Vehicle Licence fee for approximately 26 barbeques occurring from April 14, 2018 to June 17, 2018 at the Orillia Home Depot, in conjunction with the Orange Door Campaign. The remaining Refreshment Vehicle Licence fees set out in Chapter 700 of the City of Orillia Municipal Code - Business Licensing were waived.
- The Victoria Park Upgrades Capital Project budget was increased by \$78,000, funded from the Purchase of Parkland Reserve. Michael Scott Landscaping was awarded the contract for the proposed upgrades to Victoria Park for the sum of \$300,079.
- The Centennial Park Boardwalk Rehabilitation Capital Project budget was increased by \$28,000, which will be funded from the Marina Reserve. C&C Built Right Ltd. was awarded the contract for the proposed Centennial Park boardwalk rehabilitation for the sum of \$171,185 plus HST.
- Staff was directed to host a meeting in May 2018 at the Orillia City Centre to solicit input from the public and ground transportation industry regarding the draft by-law set out in Schedule "A" of Report CD-18-10 containing regulations for transportation network, auxiliary service transportation, and taxicab companies. The two liaison Council members for Corporate Services were appointed to assist in the facilitation of the meeting. Staff was directed to report to Council Committee on June 18, 2018 on the results of the consultation process along with a proposed by-law for Committee's consideration and recommendation.
- Further to Report AHART-01-2018 from the Ad Hoc Public Art Committee, staff was directed to investigate the logistics of deferring the management of the City's Public Art Program to an external agency using the committee structure set out in Schedule

“B” of the report. The Ad Hoc Public Art Committee, having completed its mandate, was dissolved.

- The report from the Clerk's Department regarding Council procedure with respect to discussions concerning the Dougall Canal was received as information.
- The report from the Clerk's Department regarding outstanding Council referrals was received as information. Staff was directed to circulate the outstanding referrals on a monthly basis.
- Chapter 538 of the Municipal Code - Use of City Road Allowances and Water Lots was adopted as set out in Schedule “A” of Report CD-18-11 from the Clerk's Department. Chapter 251 of the City of Orillia Municipal Code - Delegated Authority was amended to designate the Director of Environmental Services and Operations, or designate, with the authority to administer all or part of Chapter 538, including the signing of documents to issue or deny a Barge or Road Occupancy Permit Application, or to revoke a Barge or Road Occupancy Permit. Within Schedule “A” the definition of “mooring” read as follows: “moor” means to fasten, affix, tie, park, or anchor a boat, including solely by propulsion, to a dock or pier or part thereof, and/or to City-owned property, and the term “moored” shall have a corresponding meaning.”
- The report from the Development Services and Engineering Department regarding an overview of Bill 139, the Building Better Communities and Conserving Watersheds Act and associated amendments to the Planning Act was received as information.

Enquiries:

- Staff be directed to prepare a report with respect to the following:
The feasibility of reducing parking enforcement in the downtown and redistributing enforcement resources to other by-laws. The report is to include an option of redistributing enforcement resources to proactively enforcing Chapter 834 of the City of Orillia Municipal Code - Clean and Clear. In addition, the report is to identify potential funding sources to offset anticipated parking fine revenue loss and other options to alleviate ticket/meter anxiety for downtown parking. Information is to be reported in conjunction with the April 9, 2018 Council referral regarding the implications of providing free parking in metered and permit parking lots.

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Monday, April 23, 2018 in addition to the listing above. This includes changes or recorded votes to recommendations from the April 16, 2018 Council Committee meeting:

- Further to the Public Meeting of Council held on April 9, 2018, Council approved Zoning By-law Amendment Application No. D14-874 (2547609 Ontario Inc. - 475 Memorial Avenue) in accordance with the Draft Zoning By-law Amendment as set out in the Supplementary Memo dated April 17, 2018 from the Development Services and Engineering Department.
- Council adopted the recommendations as set out on the Consent Agenda for the regular meeting of Council on April 23, 2018.
- Open Public Forum:
 - 8 people spoke regarding the Orillia Power Distribution sale to Hydro One.
- In accordance with Section 22.2.16 (c) and (d) of Chapter 22 of the City of Orillia Municipal Code - Council - Procedure regarding Open Public Forum - Procedure, Council waived notice to allow an additional person speak during open forum.
