



# Highlights from the Council Chamber

## Council Meeting – June 27, 2022

Below are highlights of what Council adopted at its meeting on Monday, June 27, 2022.

**The following includes changes or recorded votes to recommendations from the June 20, 2022 Council Committee meeting. The wording below does not represent the exact wording of the motion and is meant as highlights of what was adopted.**

- The Shareholder (City of Orillia) ratified the Orillia Power Generation's Board of Directors' dividend motion of April 28, 2022 and approved payment of a dividend to the Shareholder in the amount of \$1,000,000 by June 30, 2022.
- Council approved Zoning By-law Amendment Application No. D14-916 (Brent Frith - 2772090 Ontario Corp.) as set out in the Supplementary Memo dated June 20, 2022 from the Development Services and Engineering Department.
- The decision with respect to the Draft Plan of Subdivision 43T-21002, Draft Plan of Common Elements Condominium 43CD-21001 and Zoning By-law Amendment D14-908 (Landen Homes 388 Inc. - 388 West Street North) was deferred further to a peer review of the Geotechnical and Hydrogeological Investigations Report prepared by Golder Associates Ltd. and acceptance by the Development Services and Engineering Department's Engineering Division demonstrating compliance with Policies 3.5.3.7 and 6.2.3 of the City of Orillia Official Plan.

The following motion was further postponed to the July 18, 2022 Council Committee meeting:

- Staff were directed to prepare a report with respect to the following:
  - The feasibility of painting the four corner crosswalks located at the intersections of West and Mississauga Streets, before Canada Day 2022 or the Civic Holiday, to celebrate and honour diversity and inclusion within the community as follows:
    - Stripes of red, yellow, black and white to represent the colours of the four races
    - Stripes of violet, indigo, green, yellow, orange and red to represent the Pride flag
    - Stripes of orange to honour children who attended residential schools
    - Stripes of red and white to represent all Canadians
    - A maple leaf situated in the centre of the intersection

The subject report was deemed a priority and will be presented to Council Committee on May 9, 2022.

- Staff were directed to prepare a report to Council Committee on the feasibility, logistics and costs associated with installing a fridge, freezer and pantry located at the Orillia Public Library to support access to nutritious food for residents.
- Council supported the request for an additional \$16,000 from the Orillia and Area Physician Recruitment and Retention Committee. The funding will be appropriated from the Operating Contingency Account.

**The following are recommendations from Council Committee on June 27, 2022 that were adopted by Council with no changes on June 20, 2022.**

- The disposition and acquisition of land as described in confidential Report CS-22-29 was approved. The Mayor and Clerk were authorized to execute all documentation necessary to effect the disposition and acquisition of land as described in the report.
- The report regarding an update on the Cyber Security Research Project led by Lakehead University was received as information.
- Policy 7.3.6.1. - Acceptable Behaviour Policy will be amended as set out in Schedule "A" of Report CS-22-27.
- The Mayor and Clerk were authorized to execute a Development Charges Late Payment Agreement with David Robb for a one-year period in the amount of \$6,220.62 representing the total municipal development charges payable for the first phase of redevelopment at 48 Peter Street South. An annual interest rate of Prime + 2% per annum as per Policy 4.3.1.3. - Development Charge Interest Rate Policy will be applied to the outstanding fees.
- The report regarding the feasibility of implementing an all-way stop at the intersection of Westmount Drive South and Rose Avenue was received as information.
- The report regarding the feasibility of implementing all-way stops at Nottawasaga Street and Douglas Street as well as Nottawasaga Street and McKenzie Street was received as information.
- In accordance with Policy 4.4.1.1. - Reserve and Reserve Fund Policy, the following favourable variances will be transferred:
  - The 2021 Winter Control operating program amount of \$536,778 to the Winter Stabilization Reserve;
  - The 2021 supplemental taxation amount of \$217,023 to the Tax Appeal Reserve Fund;
  - The 2021 Building Standards operating program amount of \$178,458 to the Building Standards Service Continuity Reserve Fund;
  - The remaining 2021 property tax supported operating budget variance will be allocated 90% or \$510,387 to the City's General Asset Management Reserve Fund and 10% or \$56,710 to the Tax Rate Stabilization Reserve.
- Staff were directed to prepare a report to Budget Committee regarding the feasibility of implementing dog waste bins throughout the Orillia trail systems. The report is to identify potential funding sources including sponsorships, private partnerships, and community fundraising efforts.
