Statistics Canada is proud to reveal the country's many rich stories and explore "Your census, your stories: Canada's portrait." The fifth release of findings from the 2021 Census is now available online at www.statcan.gc.ca/census and includes data insights on **First Nations people, Métis and Inuit in Canada; and Canada's housing portrait.**

First Nations people, Métis and Inuit in Canada

Over multiple decades, census data have revealed that the Indigenous population has grown quickly—at a pace far surpassing that of the non-Indigenous population.

The Indigenous peoples release will examine the growth and diversity of the Indigenous population, including First Nations people, Métis and Inuit. It includes information about the average age of the Indigenous population and its growth since 2016. This release will be supplemented by two Census in Brief articles: the first one will examine the housing conditions of First Nations people, Métis and Inuit in Canada, and the second will present data from the new question on membership in a Métis organization or Settlement.

These data are used to provide socioeconomic information to First Nations people, Métis and Inuit across Canada. Among other things, the results will help Indigenous peoples, their communities, their organizations and their governments to develop language and school programs, develop or expand community health and social services, make decisions regarding business and economic opportunities, and evaluate existing programs and new service needs.

Canada's housing portrait

The housing landscape in Canada has changed over the past decade, against a backdrop of record low interest rates, increased construction of condominiums, and rising home prices.

Having a home affects almost every aspect of life. As such, housing data are important to informing a number of policies at all levels of government which are aimed at helping Canadians access safe, adequate and affordable housing.

The data include key housing indicators, such as the rate of homeownership, the share of households living in condominiums and the share of households living in shelter not

considered affordable.

Coming soon

The next release, on October 26, 2022, will add further depth to the portrait of Canada. It will provide a portrait of citizenship and immigration in Canada and the ethnocultural and religious composition of the population, as well as information on the mobility and migration of Canadians. Good afternoon;

Please find below a resolution requesting support for streamlining governing legislation for Physicians in Ontario.

Resolution No. COU-2022-346

Moved by Councillor Ron Anderson

Seconded by Councillor Emily Rowley

Whereas attracting primary health care providers, including doctors, to Brighton and other small communities has been a difficult task;

And Whereas the Provincial Government announced a tuition program to attract nurses to underserved areas of Ontario;

Now be it resolved that the Municipality of Brighton Council requests that the Government of Ontario provide funding and change legislation to allow the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO) to implement the changes proposed in their letter to the Minister of Health on August 18, 2022. Which includes:

- Exempting IEP's from the regulatory requirement to have Canadian experience (re-do residency) where all other requirements are met; and
- Implementing Practice Ready Assessment programs similar to those already used in seven (7) other provinces.

And further that the Government of Ontario develop a similar tuition program to attract family doctors to underserved areas of Ontario;

And further that this motion is circulated to the Premier of Ontario, the Minister of Health, MPP David Piccini, and all municipalities across Ontario and the Association of the Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) for endorsement.
