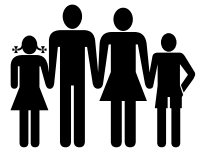

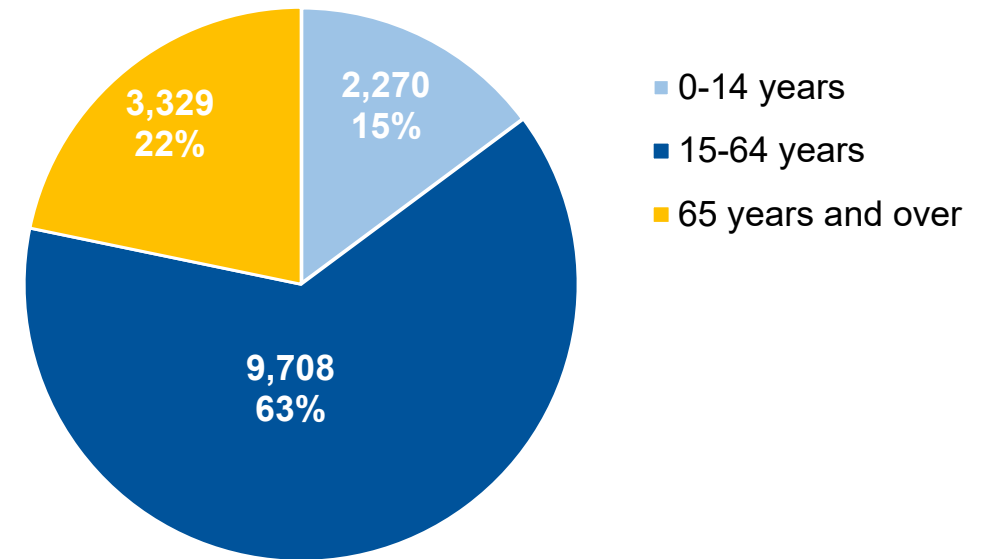

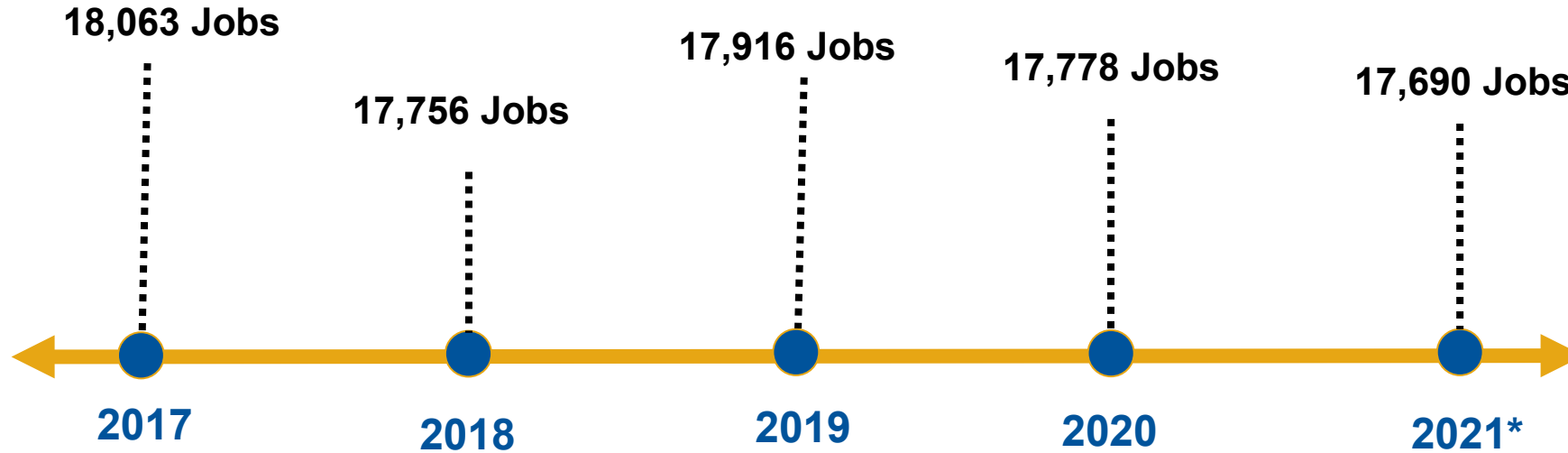

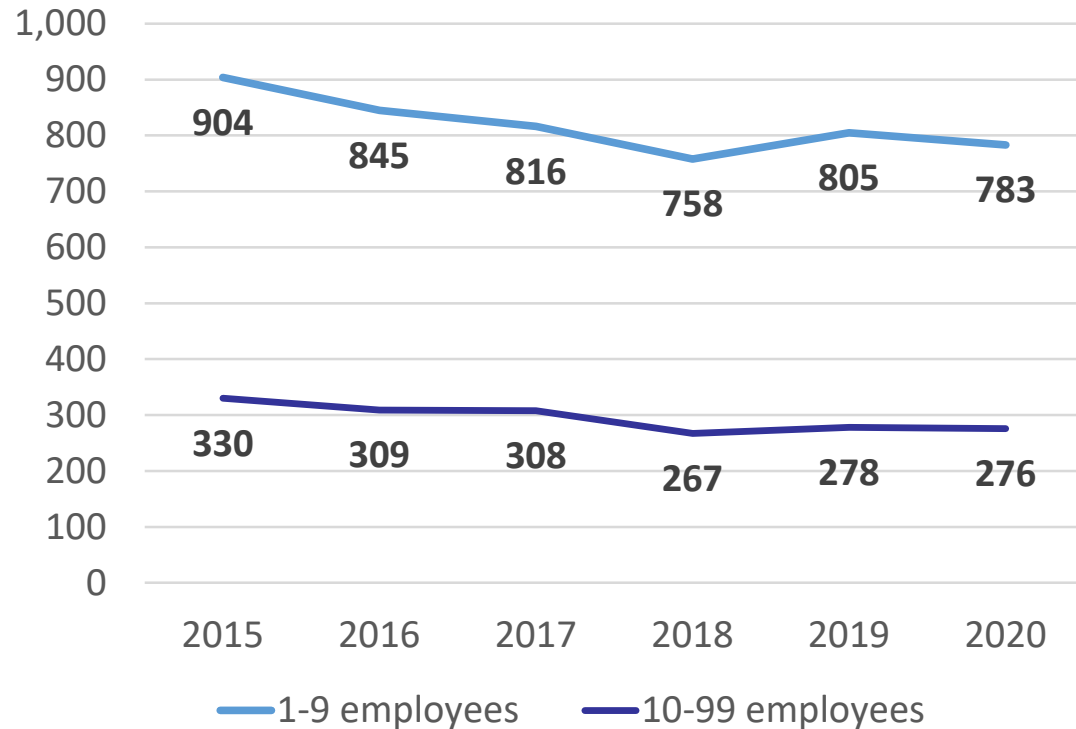

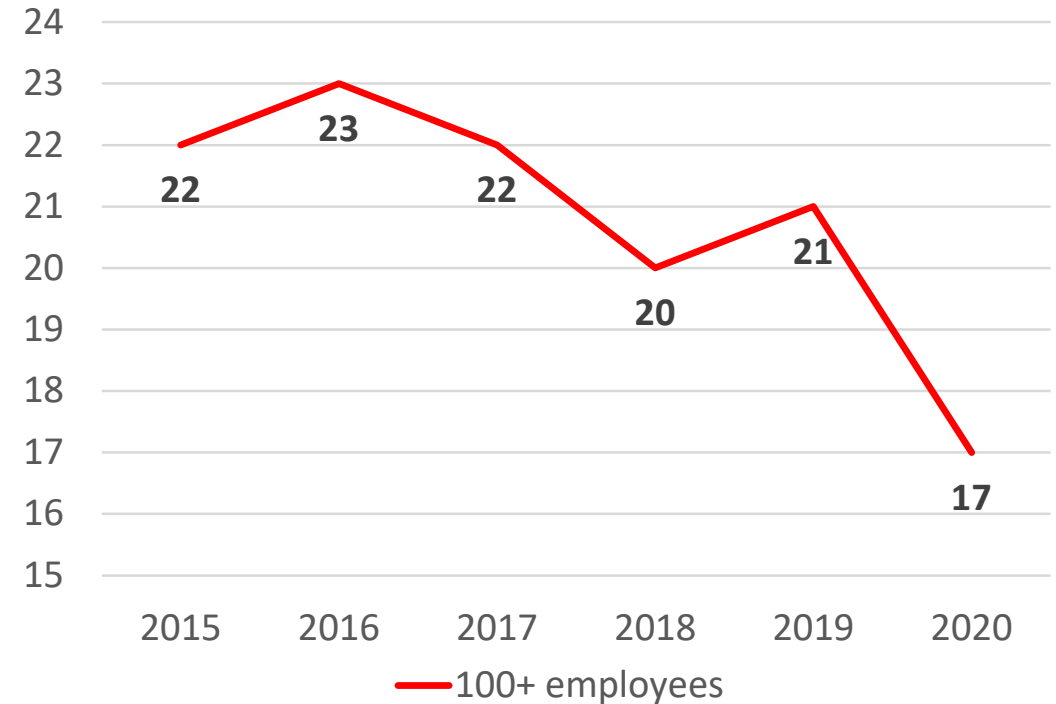


Number of Employers 2015-2020

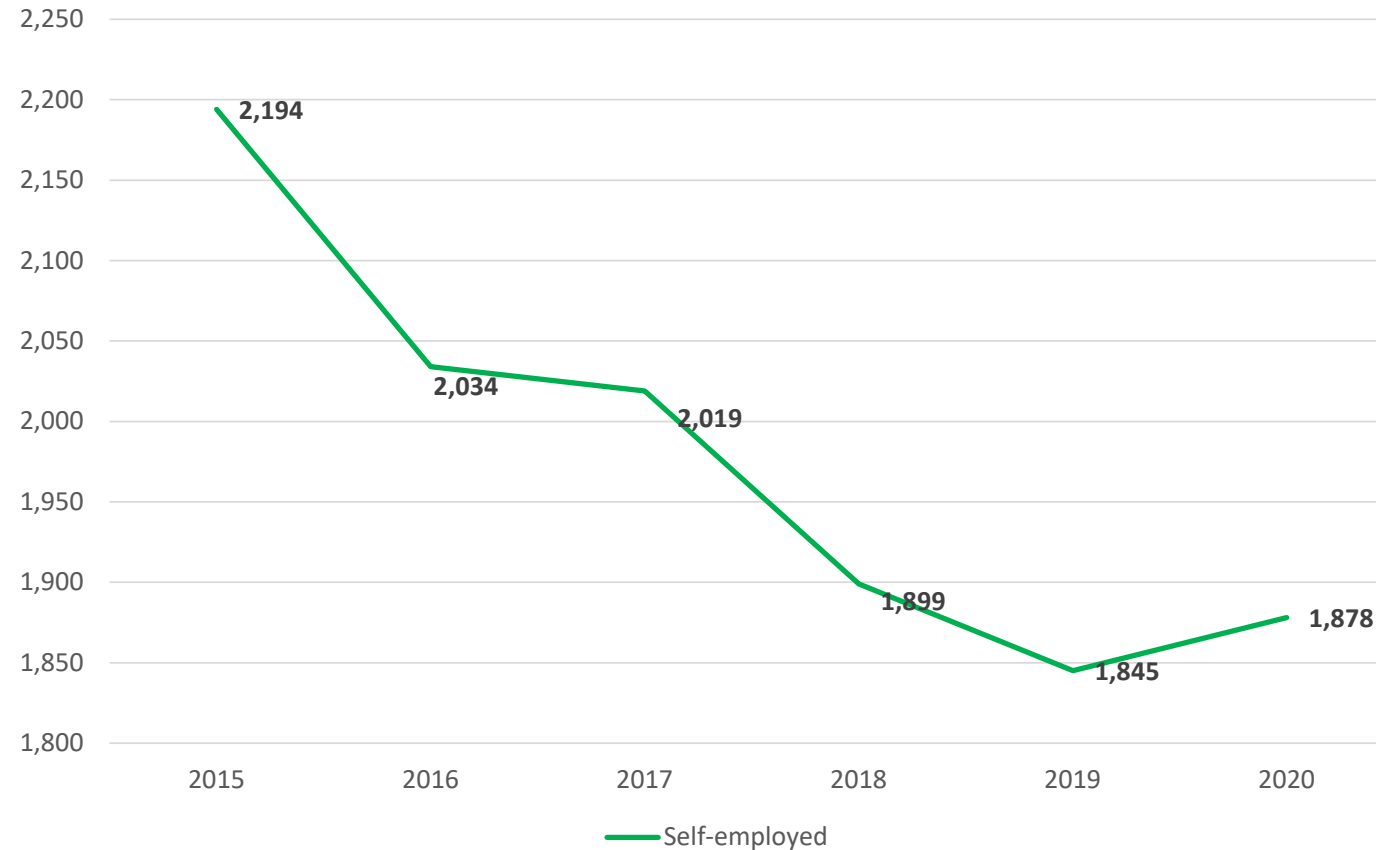

2015 – 2019 Building Permits Value (\$000)

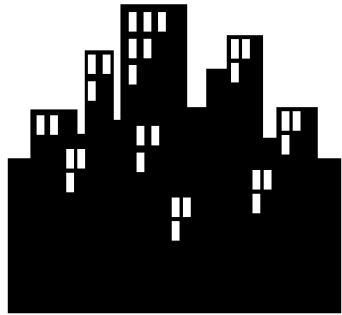

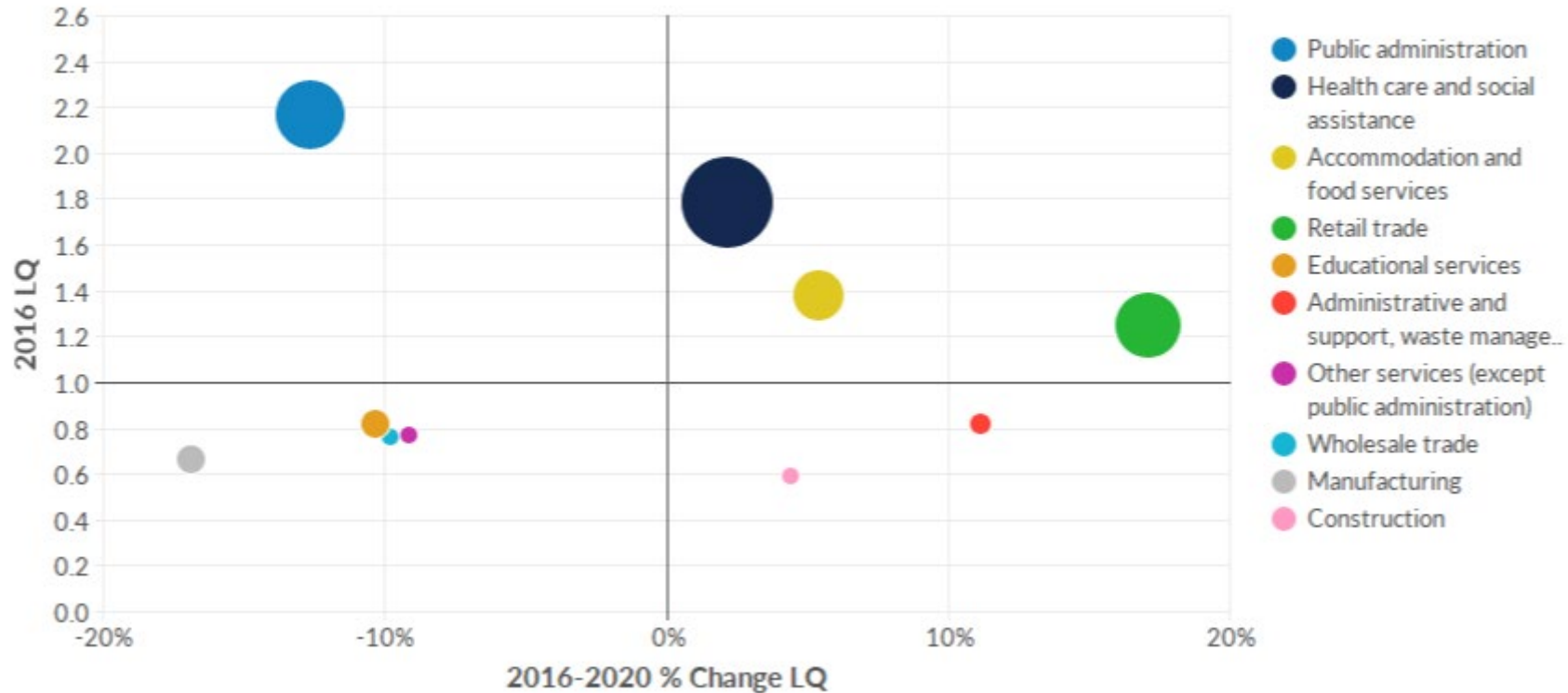

Location Quotient 2019-2021

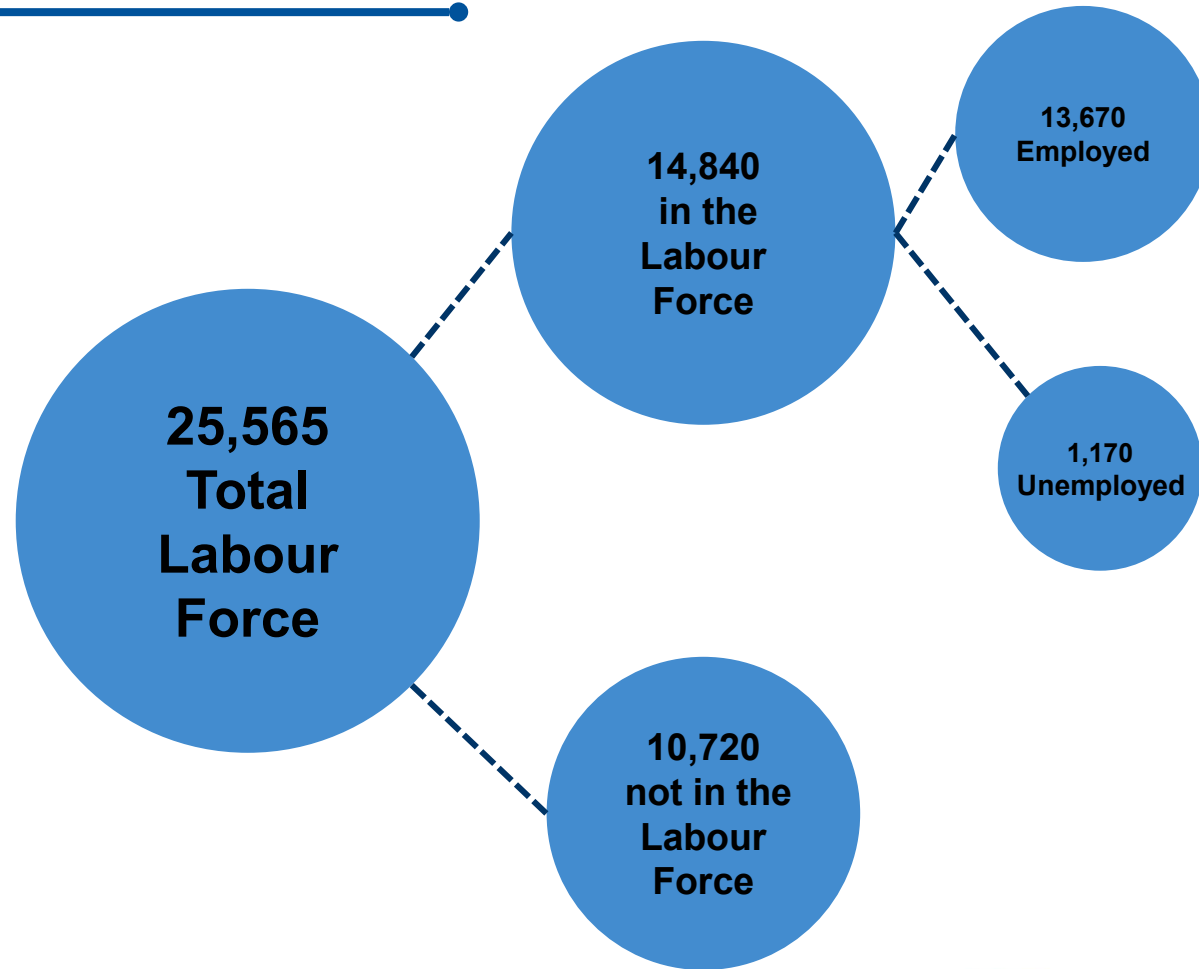
Industry Group Location Quotient Comparison



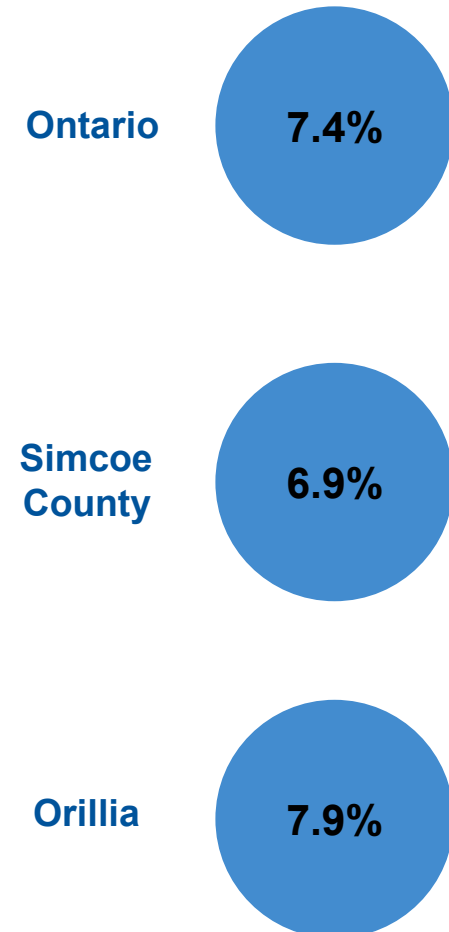

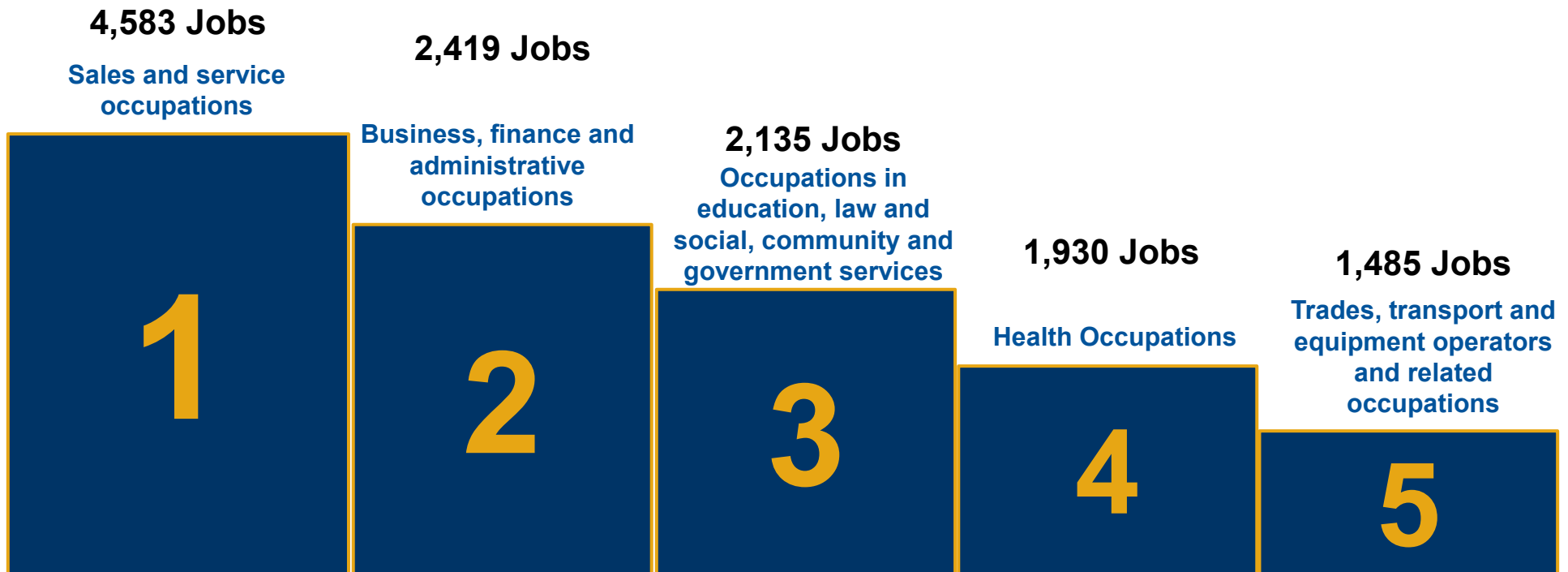
