Transit Pass/Parking Permit Exchanges Available

Transit Pass Exchanges - Available Until Sept. 30, 2020

If you purchased a monthly transit pass for the months of April, May and June, you can redeem these passes for an equal number of months for September, October and November. Transit pass exchanges can be completed at Orillia City Centre until Sept. 30, 2020. New passes can also be purchased at Orillia City Centre.

Parking Permit Exchanges - Available Until Dec. 24, 2020

If you pre-purchased a municipal parking lot permit before March 19, 2020, you can transfer your April to August permits for an equal number of months up to January 2021. Parking permit exchanges can be completed at Orillia City Centre until Dec. 24, 2020.

We encourage you to book an appointment at orillia.ca/online-services to complete your exchange or purchase; however, Orillia City Centre will be open for walk-ins Monday to Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Notice of Public Meeting Re: Zoning By-Law Amendment Housekeeping Amendment No. 6

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia will hold an Electronic Public Meeting on Oct. 26, 2020 at 2:30 p.m. to consider a municipally initiated Zoning By-law Amendment.

Purpose and Effect:

The purpose and effect of the Zoning By-law Amendment (City File No. D14-890) is to effect housekeeping amendments to the City's Comprehensive Zoning By-law 2014-44 to improve and clarify various provisions. The housekeeping amendments apply to all properties in the City.

The amendment also includes five site-specific mapping changes shown on the Location Map, as follows:

2 Hunter Valley Rd.

Correct the zoning on the eastern parking area associated with the former Nordia building from the "Open Space One" (OS1) Zone to the "Business Park Industrial Exception Five" (M3-5) Zone.

10 Matchedash St. S. (a.k.a. 161 Mississaga St. E.)

Change the zoning on this property from the "Mixed Use Intensification – Intensification Area" (C4i) Zone to the "Main Street Commercial" (C1) zone to correct a mapping error.

79 West St. S. and Part of 107 West St. S.

Correct a mapping error which currently zones these properties as "Main Street Commercial – Intensification Area (Holding Four)" (C1i(H4)). The correct zoning of "Mixed Use Intensification – Intensification Area (Holding Four)" (C4i(H4)) will be applied to the properties.

4501 Uthhoff Line

Remove the "Holding Three" (H3) zone from the City-owned lands zoned "Business Park Industrial" (M3). Adjust boundaries of M3, EP, R3-1 and R3-2 Zones to align with stream boundaries.

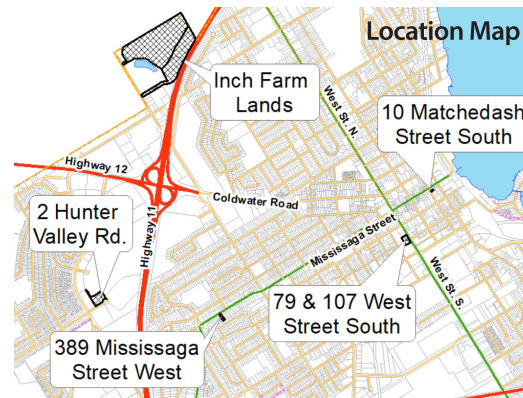
389 Mississaga St. W.

Reinstate site-specific zoning granted under the City's previous Zoning By-law to permit only a beauty salon on this property.

PLEASE NOTE that due to the physical distancing requirements imposed during the current COVID-19 pandemic, this Public Meeting will be held electronically. IF YOU INTEND TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING you are required to register with the Deputy Clerk (mwilliams@orillia.ca, 705-325-5408) by no later than noon on Oct. 25, 2020. Upon registration, the necessary information required to join the meeting will be provided to you. Please note that access to a computer with an internet or phone connection is required to participate in the meeting. Written submissions prior to the meeting date are required from those parties intending to participate in the meeting in order that your comments are on record in the event of any technical difficulties. ANY PERSON OR AGENCY who is of the opinion that holding the hearing as an electronic hearing is likely to cause them significant prejudice may make a submission to the Deputy Clerk in writing by delivery to the City drop slot or by email to mwilliams@orillia.ca on or before noon on Oct. 25, 2020, and if City of Orillia Council is satisfied that holding the hearing as an electronic hearing is likely to cause the party significant prejudice then the hearing will be rescheduled as an oral hearing. If a person or agency does not make a submission to the Deputy Clerk in this manner by noon on Oct. 25, 2020, and the person or agency does not participate in the hearing in accordance with this Notice, then the Public Meeting may proceed without the party's participation and the party will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceeding.
